Homily



Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,
Not long ago, I met two sisters who had each lost their beloved husbands. Both had lived long lives as married couples, cherishing and loving one another deeply. One sister had two daughters, and the other had two sons. They were standing before the same pain of loss, yet their responses to that pain were different. The sister with two daughters made a firm decision to rise again, because she still had daughters who needed her care. During the day, she took care of the household and her children, and at night she worked to support her family. She kept her longing for her husband in her heart, but she did not cling to resentment or regret. Instead, she transformed her grief into prayer. Because she believed in God, she lived with the hope that death is not the end. The sister with two sons, however, was still hesitating. She kept saying, “If only my husband had lived a few more years.” She was holding tightly to the past and could not let it go. She continued to look at the work her husband used to do and the emptiness he left behind, unable to set down the heavy burden in her heart. I told her that she had dependable sons and that she should not push herself too hard. I reminded her that she could continue her husband’s work together with her sons. Above all, I told her that nothing would make her husband in heaven happier than seeing his wife gather strength and continue living. She nodded, but she had not yet fully responded to that question placed before her.

When we read the Scriptures, we often encounter moments when God asks questions of human beings. These are not questions asked to obtain information, because God already knows everything. Rather, they are questions that call human beings to stand before themselves and

before God. In other words, God’s questions are not interrogations but invitations; not condemnation but doors to repentance. In the Book of Genesis, God asks Adam, “Where are you?” This is not a question about Adam’s physical location. God does not ask because He does not know where Adam is hiding in the garden. This question asks about Adam’s spiritual position—whether he is still standing within a relationship with God. After sinning, Adam hides because he can no longer stand before God. God goes in search of him, calling him back into relationship. Yet Adam’s response is not what God desires. Adam does not confess his fault. He says, “I was afraid because I was naked, so I hid,” and soon shifts the blame to the woman, and ultimately to God Himself: “The woman whom You gave me.” In these words there is not repentance but excuse, not confession but self-protection. What God desired was not an explanation, but the honest response: “I have sinned.”

Jesus also asks His disciples, “Who do you say that I am?” This question asks not only about Jesus’ identity, but also about the identity of the disciples themselves. Before this question, Peter responds, “You are the Christ, the Son of the living God.” This is not mere knowledge, but a confession of faith—not observation, but relationship. That is why Jesus says this insight was not revealed by human reasoning, but given by God. Peter’s response was the response Jesus desired, and upon that response, a mission was entrusted to him. Once again, Jesus asks a question of a scholar of the law: “Which one was neighbor to the man who fell among robbers?” This is not a test to find the correct answer, but a question meant to transform the way the scholar thinks. The scholar replies, “The one who showed him mercy.” He avoids saying “the Samaritan,” but he has already crossed the boundary of prejudice and reached the truth. Jesus immediately says, “Go and do likewise,” because a correct response must lead to action.

God’s questions are always meant to give life, but evasive answers isolate us, while honest answers lead us into mission. The difference is whether we choose to hide before God or to stand before Him; whether we avoid responsibility or respond with love. Today, God asks each of us the same questions: “Where are you?” “Who do you believe that I am?” “How do you treat your brother or sister?” Salvation already begins with God’s question, but whether that salvation is fulfilled in our lives depends on our response. The courage to stand before God without hiding or making excuses will give life to our faith today. Some may already be responding and walking the path of action, while others may still be hesitating. Yet Jesus invites us all. He tells us not to remain where we are, but to take one step forward. We are called not to choose the path of Adam, but the path of Peter and the scholar of the law—not avoidance and excuses, but response and action. When we live with response and practice rather than evasion and blame, our righteousness will open toward the Kingdom of Heaven.

“Lord, grant us the courage to respond without hiding before Your questions. Lead us not to a righteousness of words alone, but to a true righteousness lived out in our daily lives.”

- Ash Wednesday (February 18)

Not a Holy Day of Obligation, but a day of fasting and abstinence.

Ashes are imposed after the homily at Mass.

Ages 18-59: Fasting/Ages 14 and older: Abstinence

Fasting: One full meal and two smaller meals (not equal to a full meal).

Abstinence: Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all Fridays of Lent.

The sick, pregnant, and nursing mothers are exempt.
